


# MARCH 2018 EDITOR'S NOTES

Thoughts were turning to the arrival of an early spring but as this editorial is being written it looks as if spring will be on hold for a while. It is all due, apparently, to sudden stratospheric warming. If you have not heard of this before and want a little more information this is provided inside the Bugle.

The word 'March' comes from the Roman 'Martius'. This was originally the first month of the Roman calendar and was named after Mars, the god of war. March was the beginning of our calendar year. We changed to the 'New Style' or 'Gregorian calendar in 1752, and it is only since then when we the year began on 1st January. The Anglo-Saxons called the month Hlyd monath which means Stormy month, or Hraed monath which means Rugged month. All through Lent the traditional games played are marbles and skipping. The games were stopped on the stroke of twelve noon on Good Friday, which in some places was called Marble Day or Long Rope Day. The game of marbles has been played for hundreds of years and some historians say that it might have been started by rolling eggs. In the past, round stones, hazelnuts, round balls of baked clay and even cherry stones have been used.

Meredith covered their joint contribution to the planning and fund raising that led to a completely refurbished village hall all those years ago and to John's thespian qualities at Christmas suppers and shows with his great friend the late Dick Ridd. There was poetry read by Sally Taverner, a tribute from Dick Ridd's widow Joyce, read for us by Olive Taylor and a further tribute from Roger Davis who first came into frequent contact with Irene and John in 2010 through Age UK's Befriending Programme. Other written memories were also received from villagers and passed on to Myra and her family. Tribute was also made to the many carers enabling John and Irene in their later years to remain in their home in Bell Meadow. The abiding memory is of a couple who complimented each other in devoted love, were interested in everything and who were kindness personified.

# **BICKLEIGH WEATHER WATCH**


Floating quietly above the clouds, storms and other weather systems, there sits a quiescent, tenuous layer of the atmosphere called the stratosphere. Most people have heard about the stratosphere in the context of the ozone layer, when, in the 1980s it was discovered that manmade chemicals were leaking into the stratosphere and destroying ozone, which protects life on Earth from harmful ultraviolet radiation from the sun. Since then, international agreements to ban the use of the chemicals involved have halted the decline of the ozone layer and it is now on the slow road to recovery.


So is that it for the stratosphere? or is it important for other reasons? It turns out that although it does not harbour any weather and it is far too dry to rain in the stratosphere, it occasionally undergoes one of the most dramatic events in our atmosphere: a so-called 'sudden stratospheric warming'. This phenomenon really is dramatic; in just a couple of days the temperature over the North Pole in the winter stratosphere can suddenly rocket by as much as 50 degrees Celsius! Imagine if that happened here in Bickleigh - we would suddenly flip from the coldest of winter days to the scorching heat of the Sahara desert!

At the beginning of February, long range forecasts started to suggest that this is exactly what was going to happen. Then a couple of weeks later, not only did the temperature shoot up, but the winds circling around the Arctic cap ground to a halt and flipped direction, now flowing from east to west. What does this have to do with our weather? you might well ask. Well it turns out that those easterly winds slowly work their way down to where the jet stream is. Then they produce a profound change in our weather; the pressure across northern Europe rises, and the winds at the surface also flip and start flowing from the east. This means that air is blown to the UK from Siberia, and it's this last step that has caused the recent dramatic cold snap at the end of what has otherwise been an uneventful winter.




Image: Diagram of sudden stratospheric warming (MetOffice)

#### MARCH

Village Plastic Waste Bank? - "Hear, hear" I hear myself say to the radio which is speaking on the subject of plastic waste. Three score and ten years have passed and not much floors me now. I can cope with the blocked road drains on Bickleigh Hill leading to flooding and ice rink conditions in freezing weather (what are those yellow bins for?). I try to avoid the school traffic at 9 am and 3.30 am, I do not always succeed. Villagers are kind and neighbourly (on occasion probably saving a life). But I cannot cope with plastic waste. Food, tins, bottles, paper and cardboard OK! But plastic "takes the biscuit". There is I suggest a need for a village located "plastic bag bank" to which we can trudge with our armfuls of plastic. How about it readers, et al? (My Lenten gripe for the environment over – phew!).

Lent - With Easter Day falling on 1st April this year, March has suddenly become rather important as we try to fit in everything that needs to be done. The bleating of lambs and the burgeoning of Mother Nature coincides with our plans for Lent (now underway with a reflection on the patriarch of three religions, Abraham, the Friend of God), forty days of inner reflection, in tradition of penance, culminating on Palm Sunday, the 25th March.

15 March - Moses and Aaron and the atonement


