CHURCHYARD CONSERVATION

The primroses have been spectacular this year, showing that our restrictive mowing regime is beneficial. It is worth visiting Cadbury church where the whole of the churchyard is covered in primroses - something we would love to emulate at Bickleigh.

Yellow rattle has been introduced at the top end of the churchyard in order to suppress the more vigorous grasses. Yellow rattle is an attractive, semi-parasitic, grassland annual. In the past this plant was a serious pest for farmers as it weakens grasses and as a result can reduce hay yields by as much as 50%. In a landscape or garden context however, this suppression of grass growth is welcomed as it produces a better display of wild flowers and eases the mowing required.

Yellow rattle germinates late February to early March, flowers in June, and sets seed in July. At the end of each growing season as the annual yellow rattle plants die away they leave behind gaps into which new wild flowers can establish. As a result, wild flower seed sown into an existing sward will establish more readily in areas where yellow rattle already does well.

BICKLEIGH WEATHER WATCH

Following the late winter cold snap that we reported at the end of February, the winter is now over. The northern hemisphere is again tilted towards the Sun and Spring has now sprung. For us this is good news of course; the temperatures are now rising, the days are lengthening faster than at other times of year and our gardens are going through that lovely time of year when everything is green and fresh and changing so fast.

In the Arctic though, things are not so optimistic. From now until September, the amount of sea ice floating on the Arctic seas will not only be in its systematic seasonal melt towards the autumn minimum, but as in many recent years, it is also heading towards ever lower amounts at an alarming rate. In late summer we are now seeing areas of ice that are about half the area that used to be covered by sea ice just 20 or 30 years ago. Imagine our outrage if half of Britain had disappeared in that time?! Well that is exactly what's happened to the Arctic Ice cover and of course it has a dramatic impact on the local residents ranging from the Inuit population to the well-known displacement of wildlife, for example of polar bears which are now starting to struggle for territory due to the lack of sea ice.

Make no mistake, despite what occasional 'climate change deniers' like to suggest, the amount of Arctic sea ice is in severe decline and is not set to recover any time soon. This also has a profound effect on the Atlantic Ocean further South, as the melting of ice adds a lot of extra fresh water to the north Atlantic and can change the whole ocean circulation. Impacts are expected on the warm northward flow in the Gulf Stream that brings mild waters to the vicinity of the UK but we still don't know the strength of this effect or whether it could lead to a complete shut down of the Gulf Stream...




Image: Monthly March ice extent for 1979 to 2018 shows a decline of 2.7 percent per decade (National Snow and Ice Data Center).

In the meantime, we continue to watch the worrying decline in Arctic sea ice extent from our satellite eyes above the Earth and our mathematical calculations are clear that the first day that is completely ice free in the Arctic will be reported in the news in the month of September in around 15 to 20 years from now.
